2002 Foundation graduate Tiffany (Dofa) DeLeon danced with the Foundation from the age of six to 18, she now dances for Hālau Ke'alaokamaile under the direction of kumu hula Keali'i Reichel.

For the past three years Hālau Ke'alaokamaile competed in the Merrie Monarch Festival in Hilo, Hawaii, this annual festival is often referred to as the Olympics of hula. Last year the hālau won overall honors at the festival, winning first place for their kāhiko (ancient) hula performance and second place for their 'auana (modern) hula performance, in addition the winner of the Miss Aloha Hula competition was from Hālau Ke'alaokamaile.

As a result of having the most points overall they were awarded a trip to Japan this past September to perform at the Festival Na Hiwahiwa O Hawai'i at the Tokyo Dome.
